#### Background

- Sports Premium
    - For improving every child's experience of PE
    - Increasing school sport and competition
    - Increasing the physical activity of young people to develop a healthy lifestyle
  - Schools will receive funding directly.
  - Each school in North Lincs will receive £8,000 plus £5 per pupil, per year.
  - Huge investment into the area; almost £1.2m over 2 years.
- Head teachers to decide what's best for their children's needs

**At St Peter and St Paul CE Primary School we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.**

#### Finance update

- The school have paid £2500 to be part of a cluster network; this network includes 5 other local primary schools working with an SSCO from The Outwood Academy. The SSCO provides links and support with PE provision and competitive school sport events. CPD opportunities are communicated within the cluster and schools contribute ideas and opinions on what is needed.
- Cost of transport to and from competitive sports activities - £65 each trip for the coach to take us to The Outwood Academy - 5 Competitions so far this year - Total spent on transport so far is £325.
- Investigated taking all of KS1 swimming for 8 weeks, due to costings and confirmation that the majority of children already have external swimming lessons, this was decided non-sustainable.

#### Update of activities / Impact

- Attended cluster meeting 29<sup>th</sup> October - looking at sharing schemes of work / resources. Further discussions as a cluster needed to decide on the best SOW that relates to the new curriculum.
- Year 5/6 attended triathlon at The Pods.
- Year 2 cluster competition - Benchball
- Year 5/6 cluster competition - Indoor athletics
- Year 1 cluster competition - Boccia

- Year 1 cluster completion - New age Curling.
- The cluster festivals develop team work, fair play and communication skills and also an awareness of competitive sport.
- 4 Year 6s attended Primary Ambassadors Academy, a practical day where young people from across North Lincolnshire had the opportunity to learn and practice leadership skills that can be taken back to their schools, to be put into practice in a variety of settings such as lunchtime activities and after school clubs. Once trained, SSCO will work alongside Ambassadors to cascade their training to other leaders in school. This is on-going and they have planned and led PE sessions for KS1 and upper KS2.
- Sports leaders - Year 9/10 pupils from The Outwood Academy plan and lead sessions every Wednesday afternoon and Friday morning. The relationship between the children and the leaders has strengthened, leading to clear progression during these sessions. Also providing good links between schools.
- G&T sessions - Every Friday for four weeks leading to G&T Festivals in the summer term. Children in both KS1 and KS2 who have been identified as having a talent in PE will be working together. This will be led by SSCO from Brumby who will baseline the children and then bring coaches to work and train in specific areas.

- All staff to complete a PE self-assessment audit then we can see if and where any training is needed.
- Cluster competitions to continue throughout the year involving all children in the school to promote competitive sport.

### Review of Next Steps from Previous update -

- All staff to complete a PE self-assessment audit then we can see if and where any training is needed. - All staff completed audit either verbally or in a written form, the main findings were that staff didn't feel confident in delivering high quality dance and gymnastic sessions. Mentoring in both areas is now taking place throughout the whole school.
- Cluster competitions to continue throughout the year involving all children in the school to promote competitive sport. St Peter and St Pauls still belong to The Outwood Academy cluster and are continuing to be successful at cluster competitions.
- Investigations of playground markings - <http://www.playgroundmarkingsdirect.co.uk/> - also looking at what other schools have and use. Cross curricular links if possible. LB visited Messingham Primary School to look at playground markings and discuss how they are used, this is still on going.
- Resources audit to be completed. Audit and PE order completed, this will be reviewed again later in the year as the school is still growing.
- Attend cluster meetings to finalise schemes of work and assessment in PE. Schemes of work made available for all teaching staff to use.

### Finance update

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- Cost of transport to and from competitive sports activities - £65 each trip for the coach to take us to The Outwood Academy - 2 Competitions per half term.
- Dance mentoring from Street Beat Dance Academy - working with 2 teachers on a weekly basis, mentoring and team teaching to promote high quality, engaging dance sessions. **Aim - To be confident in teaching dance.**  
Mentoring sessions during Autumn 1 and Autumn 2 - working with 4 teachers altogether, 1 hour per week - £ 40 per session - 26 hours - £1,040 - This will continue through Spring Term.
- Gym mentoring from Alison Hickling, gymnastics specialist - working with 2 teachers on a weekly basis, mentoring and team teaching to promote high quality, engaging gymnastic sessions. **Aim - To be confident in teaching gymnastics.**  
Mentoring sessions during Autumn 1 - working with 2 teachers altogether, 1 hour per week - £ 40 per session - 12 hours - £480 - Possibility of this continuing later on in the school year.

- Resource audit completed - equipment now purchased and available for all sports and activities on the new National Curriculum.
- Primary Step in PE - Schemes of work written by Liz Notman, Development Manager, North Lincs School Sport Network purchased KS1 and KS2 - £350 All written based on the Primary New Curriculum.
- Street Beat Dance Academy - Enrichment club starting after Christmas - £30 per session.

### Update of activities / Impact

- Sports leaders - Year 9/10 pupils from The Outwood Academy plan and lead sessions every Wednesday afternoon and Friday morning. The relationship between the children and the leaders has strengthened, leading to clear progression during these sessions. This took place during the whole of the **summer term** - feedback and communication from both schools made this a very successful experience. Sports Leaders from both The Outwood Academy and St Bedes supported during our annual Sports day, helping to make it very successful.
- Year 5/6 cluster competition - Kwik Cricket
- Year 2 - Multi skills Festival - Cluster Competition
- Year 4 - Scatterball Festival - Cluster Competition
- Year 6 - Football tournament - Arranged internally
- Dance Mentoring - Autumn 1 and 2 - Year 1, 6, 3 and 5 - leading to confident delivery of dance sessions.
- Gymnastics Mentoring - Autumn 1 - Year 2 and 4 - leading to confident delivery of dance sessions.
- Year 2 Bench ball festival - Cluster Competition.
- Year 5 / 6 indoor athletics - Cluster Competition
- Football Tournament - Glanford Park
- Thursday Enrichment Clubs - **Sports Focus** - Football (KS1 and KS2), netball (KS2), running club (Foundation, KS1 and KS2), multi skills (Foundation and KS1) - approximately 80 children take part in these clubs.
- Street Beat Dance Academy - Enrichment club starting after Christmas on a Monday after school.

#### Review of Next Steps from Previous update -

These schemes of work for KS1 and KS2 have been written by Liz Notman and Owen Denovan - Development Manager, Schools Sports Network. They being used to support staff to plan lessons. Feedback generally is ok, but as anything they need tweaking for each individual class. Enquiring sent about Foundation stage PE planning.
- Implement a system where pupils progress in monitored.  
This has not been a focus in school over the last year therefore will continue as next steps.

Playground marking were purchased through Friends of the School and every child have benefited.
